# 3786 Acres with 47 Agreements!

We are honoured to protect two new properties with the generous donations of two new landowners. It is a humbling experience to work with people who are so connected and dedicated to protecting the Oak Ridges Moraine, and these two new donors are no exception!

The first property, almost 50 acres of Natural Core Area of the Oak Ridges Moraine, is a joint project with the Toronto Region Conservation Authority. This property is part of a provincially significant wetland in the Humber River subwatershed and provides habitat for a wide variety of plants and animals including this lovely turtle.

This property has been in the landowner's family for generations and they have many fond memories connected to the land.

Their history of wise stewardship is demonstrated

in their early adoption of a Forest Management Plan. Their motivation to donate this sensitive property comes from a deep desire to do 'what is right for the benefit of the public and future generations'.

Our second property is a stunning woodland close to a number of Regional Forests, providing a connective corridor for wildlife. This 26+ acres in the Natural Core Area of the Oak Ridges Moraine has been stressed by development on both sides but has now been protected.

The donor has now ensured that this beautiful island of green remains protected amidst the development that surrounds it. He worked closely with our staff to ensure that his property would continue to be part of the natural landscape that makes our Moraine so special.
